All belongings must be taken with you. Please leave nothing behind. All ticket holders are required to leave. Customers with All Event stamps can re-enter through the "fast track" gate.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All exhibitors must purchase a **\$ 4.00 membership** to the Dawson Creek & Exhibition Association.
2. **Exception to Rule #1: 4-H exhibitors and Junior exhibitors unless entering Adult Classes.**
3. All prize money must be picked up from the Fair office by 6:00pm on Monday, August 11th, 2025.
4. NO PRIZE MONEY will be mailed out.
5. All exhibits must stay on display until 5:00pm on Sunday, August 10th, 2025.
6. In the absence of competition in any class or if entries exhibited are of inferior quality, the Judges will award only such prizes as they deem the exhibit merits.
7. All entries except Livestock must be the creation, or the product of the effort and work of the exhibitor and must have been completed within the previous 12 months, unless otherwise stated.
8. Should any question arise not provided for in the Rules & Regulations, the decision of the Board of Directors is final.
9. Protests must be made in writing stating the grounds for the protest and accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00, which will not be refunded if the protest is deemed frivolous by the Protest Committee. No protest should be entertained regarding the merit of an animal, or an article exhibited. The decision of the Judge or Judges on the point is final.
10. All exhibitors please take note of the RESPONSIBILITY CLAUSE when exhibiting entries in all Sections.
11. Division entries may be done online or emailed but must be accompanied by a Visa or M/C number.
12. **All Online Entries close Tuesday August 5th, 2025. Entries after this date must be made at Fair Summer Office.**

RESPONSIBILITY CLAUSE:

The Dawson Creek Exhibition Association and the Livestock Committee will not be responsible for any loss, personal injury or damage to livestock exhibited or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person or any animal or damage to any property while on the grounds by any livestock owned or exhibited by persons and shall indemnify the management against all legally established claims or damages of any kind or nature that may grow out of any injury occasioned by any livestock owned and exhibited by persons.

POSITION STATEMENT ON ANIMAL RIGHTS & ANIMAL WELFARE

The Dawson Creek Exhibition Association produces and manages the Annual Dawson Creek Exhibition and Stampede in the City of Dawson Creek. Our volunteer driven event is a celebration of our Country Heritage and Western Tradition and has become one of the largest community-based events in Northern B.C.

The Dawson Creek Exhibition Association supports responsible and humane use of animals and believes that all animals utilized in entertainment, industry and sport should be afforded proper care, treatment, and management. We also believe that all rodeo events, and rodeo animal welfare practices in sanctioned and approved Pro Rodeo's, Chuckwagon's and Agriculture Fair events should be observed and viewed only on an animal-by-animal basis, not by the event(s) animals are in.

The Dawson Creek Exhibition Association does not support animal rights philosophies that call for the end of all use and interaction with animals. Animal rights in its purest form, focuses on whether humans have the right to view and use animals as partners or resources.

EXHIBITOR - PARKING/TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

All areas, except for the designated camping spaces, are considered Loading/Unloading zones. Livestock exhibitors are permitted to park in these areas while loading/unloading animals and equipment ONLY. Maximum duration of parking in these areas is 20 minutes and must be prior to 8:30am and after 10:00pm during the fair. Any vehicle parked in the loading/unloading areas after 8:30am and prior to 10:00pm will be towed at the owner's expense. This rule is for the safety of the public, exhibitors and animals, and exhibitors who violate this rule may be disqualified or barred from entering subsequent years as deemed appropriate by the Directors.

Permission to park campers and motorhomes will only be granted to livestock exhibitors who have paid their membership and entry fees. There is no charge for camping for exhibitors. Camping is ONLY in designated areas: along the light horse show ring and north side of the cattle barn. THESE VEHICLES MUST HAVE A VALID "CAMPING PASS" THAT MUST BE OBTAINED AT THE FAIR OFFICE IN ADVANCE AND WILL BE CHECKED DAILY. Stock trailers may be parked for the duration of the Fair in the designated dry parking section behind the show barn. Stock trailers must be unhooked from vehicle. Area Entrance will be marked.

NO PARKING WILL BE PERMITTED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS.

TRAFFIC: UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL VEHICLES (EXCEPT AMBULANCES, FIRE OR POLICE) BE PERMITTED TO MOVE WITHIN THE FAIRGROUNDS BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 8:00am AND 10:00pm, WEDNESDAY THROUGH SATURDAY (AUGUST 6-9, 2025) AND BETWEEN THE HOURS 8:00am AND 9:00pm SUNDAY (AUGUST 10, 2025)

NO DOGS ON THE FAIRGROUNDS OTHER THAN SEEING EYE DOGS ON A LEASH

NO COOLERS OR BACKPACKS - ANY PATRON MAY BE SEARCHED BY SECURITY IF SECURITY FEELS IT IS NECESSARY FOR SAFETY ON THE GROUNDS Due to the high volume of traffic and spectators coming into the Fairgrounds for the Chuckwagon Race Meet "Dash for Cash" Sunday from 4:00pm to 6:00pm, and the moving out of spectators following the Chuckwagon Race Meet, the following schedule will be in effect:

4-H Division (A)

Director: Stephanie Bueckert

Rules & Regulations:

- All exhibitors must be members of a registered 4-H Club. Membership proof is required.
- To exhibit in any of the 4-H Livestock classes, you must be registered in that project.
- Cloverbud: 6-8 years of age, as of December 31st of the previous year.
- Juniors: 9-12 years of age as of December 31st of the previous year.
- Seniors: 13-21 years of age as of December 31st of previous year.
- Sections 1 - 5 and non-livestock projects are open to all 4-H members.
- Animal Identification must be provided for all livestock (can get copy from 4-H Leader).
- All Livestock exhibits must be projects for the current year.
- 4-H members may enter open classes with their livestock. Open class entry fees are to be paid by the member.
- Judges will place the exhibits and their decisions will be accepted as final.
- Water will be available on site, but each exhibitor must provide feed and bedding and look after his/her livestock.
- The Exhibition Assn. will not be responsible for any losses or accidents to exhibits.
- Cattle need to be on the grounds by 3:00pm Thursday. Weigh ins will take place Friday at 10:00am in the cattle barn.
- Displays and animals must remain on the grounds until 5:00pm on Sunday. If they are removed earlier, without prior arrangement, the prize money may be forfeited.
- The conduct of exhibitors is expected to always be appropriate. Behavior that is not becoming to 4-H can result in removal of exhibits from classes and forfeit of Prize Money.
- 4-H Exhibits accepted Wednesday 12pm-5pm.
- All 4-H Exhibits will be judged Wednesday between 6:00pm to 9:00pm.
- The deadline for Registration for live animal classes is Tuesday, August 5th
- 4-H Members must wear their club shirts when showing or competing in Livestock Events.
- Rules will be based on 4-H BC Rules & Regulations

Notes:

- The 4-H program provides young people with an opportunity to learn how to become productive, self-assured adults who can make their community and country a good place in which to live. This is fostered through project and program work, experiences with their 4-H club members and leaders and their participation in district, regional and provincial events. The goal of the 4-H program is youth development. The objectives of 4-H clubs are knowledge, leadership, citizenship, and personal development. Although 4-H is a youth organization with members ranging in age from 6 to 21, it is an organization that encourages the whole family to be involved, whether it be in support of a 4-H member or as a volunteer – leader, judge, educational presenter, or event organizer. All 4-H projects on display are made/raised/trained throughout the 4-H year. The award system is designed to aid individual personal development of the 4-H member, where awards are given based on the 4-H member's personal achievement.

During the fair come out and talk to the 4-H members and leaders about the 4-H program, located in the Home Arts Building.

On show days, there is a frenzy of activity as animals are prepared for the ring and the members ready themselves for inspection by the Judge.

- All Exhibitors must provide Provincial Insurance number: BC Horse Council, Alberta Equine Federation, or Insurance of equal value.
- All Exhibitors must attend meeting Wednesday, 6:00pm at Draft Horse Ring.
- All Pull Exhibitors must be stabled and attend meeting Saturday, 9:00am at Draft Horse Ring.
- All Junior Exhibitors must have a signed form by Parent or Legal Guardian accompanying entry form.
- All Juniors to be accompanied by an Adult in Driving, Hitch, and Log Skid Classes.

- Boundary lines are 16 feet apart in all classes.
- Length of pull 14 feet - Allowed two tries to make 14 feet. Any movement of the boat is considered a try. The pin and chain laid out flat measures 14 feet. Pin must be out completely to qualify as a pull.
- All team weights must be shown on entry form to determine the proper class.
- Teams will be weighed on the grounds prior to the show.
- All classes will be pulled pounds overweight.
- Off set double trees allowed.
- Neck yokes allowed.
- Each Teamster is allowed two helpers. 1 Header, 1 Hooker OR 2 Hookers. Teamster and Hookers may stay behind doubletree when team is pulling. If helpers coach or interfere while the team is hooked to the boat, the team will be disqualified and revert to previous completed pull.
- Teamster or Hooker may ride in the boat. (Must stay in boat the entire pull.)
- While hooked to the boat the team must stay within the guidelines if the team steps on or over the guidelines they will be disqualified and allowed their previous completed pull. A teamster may ask the Judge to center the boat before hooking. If there is no means available to center the boat, the Judge may wave off the guidelines rule and ask the Teamster to center the boat during the pull.
- If a break in harness or equipment occurs, there will be a time limit of 5 minutes to fix the break and complete the pull. If a teamster forfeits the pull at which the breakage occurred, he must pull the next weight the full distance or the weight goes back to the previous completed pull.
- Deliberate stalling will result in disqualification.
- The Committee reserves the right to conduct a spot check by a veterinarian for contesting teams. Unethical use of drugs will result in disqualification and forfeiture of all winnings.
- Deliberate jerking of the load is prohibited. If the infraction occurs, the team is eliminated from the pull and allowed their previous completed pull.
- Judge's decisions are final. No consultation with the Judge shall be allowed.
- Any entry may be excused by the Judge without explanation, if the Judge deems the entry is unsafe or incorrect for the class.

- Once a team is hooked, started into, or asked to pull, the team must stay between the guidelines until the pull is completed and team is unhooked.
- Team allowed two tries to move the boat 14'.
- A teamster has the option of waiving the first lift. 2nd lift must be pulled by teamster taking the option.
- Teamster may unhook after first try and has 3 minutes to re-hook and complete the pull.
- If only one Class, Class shall be from heaviest team to lightest team, or by order deemed by the committee.
- All pullers must enter 1 other Draft Horse Class to be eligible to enter Pull Classes. (Your choice)
- Teamster is not to touch, whip or slap lines during the pull or will be disqualified and revert to previous weight pulled. (Judge's discretion)
- **Draft Horse Pull may not be entered by a Junior Exhibitor 19 and under.**

Notes: How to Prepare Your Vegetable Entries:

- **Beans:** Trim stems to 1/2"
- **Beets:** Trim tops to 1", leave roots intact
- **Broccoli:** Bunches should be trimmed to about 7" in length. Note: keep under refrigeration until exhibit to prevent flowerets from opening.
- **Cabbage:** Trim stalk, leaving one or two of the outer leaves on. Heads should be uniform & firm.
- **Carrots:** Trim tops to 1/2", leave roots intact
- **Note: length is determined by edible portion.**
- **Cauliflower:** Remove stalk and large leaves. Trim off remaining leaves just below the level of the curd.
- **Kohlrabi:** Trim roots and leaf stems close to the bulb.
- **Lettuce:** Remove roots and small or damaged outside leaves.
- **May be displayed in a Ziploc bag with water**
- **Onions:** Trim roots and tops to 1/2", remove only the dirty outer scales, do not wash.
- **Peppers:** Leave stems on
- **Potatoes:** No greening or scabs. Do not wash, just brush off the dry soil
- **Rhubarb:** Stalks to be uniform in size and color, tops trimmed to 1", leave roots intact, but clean.
- **Rutabaga:** Tops trimmed to 1", Roots intact
- **Celery:** Trim roots, may be displayed in a Ziploc bag with water
- **Garlic:** Trim tops and roots to 1/2 inch

TEAM SORTING

Four (4) man timed event where cattle must be sorted and penned

1. Four (4) person event.
2. Two (2) minute time limit.
3. Thirty (30) second warning will be given.
4. Time will start when the first rider crosses the line.
5. Announcer will call a number and the steer must be penned.
6. Herd must be worked in a relaxed and controlled manner.
7. Team will be disqualified if more than (4) steers are across the line.
8. Teams are allowed one odd number across the foul line, but the steer must be cleared back to the herd before time is called.

TEAM DOCTORING

Four (4) person timed event representing how rope and treat a sick animal in the pasture.

1. Four (4) person event.
2. Two (2) minute time limit.
3. Once the animal has been headed and heeled, the third team member removes the head loop and ropes the front legs and ensures that the back legs are both roped.
4. When heading, front leg loop is accepted; belly loop and both legs are both accepted. Third team member marks the steer as treated with a coloured marker.
5. Fourth team member may hold the herd or assist (hold a horse, etc.)
6. Time is called when the doctor (third team member) returns to the saddle, is mounted, and the steer still has two front legs and the 2 hind legs in the loop.
7. Four (4) loop limit.
8. No major herd disruptions or scattering of the herd allowed. Dally short no long, sloppy handles.
9. Any rope lost is a disqualification.

TEAM BRANDING

Four (4) person timed event where a calf must be roped and branded.

1. Four (4) person event.
2. Four (4) minute time limit.
3. Branding three (3) calves.
4. Only one (1) branding iron involved.
5. 30 (thirty) second penalty added to time if only one (1) foot is roped.
6. Calf must be across chalk line before wrestlers can touch the calf. (There is no disqualification if the contestant touches the rope when behind line)
7. Disqualification if heeler drags single high hock across line.
8. Branding iron cannot leave the pot before the rope is off the calf.
9. Any lost rope is a disqualification.
10. Only one calf can cross the line at a time per team.
11. Once a team has branded the first calf, all other calves must be branded on the same side and location.
12. Time will stop when the branding iron is returned to the pot.
13. No rough handling and break out of trot shake down high hocks in a smooth manner
14. Disqualification at the judge's discretion.

STRAY GATHERING

Four (4) person timed event where two stray steers are turned loose in the arena, and you must rope and tie them down before the two-minute time limit.

1. Four (4) person event.
2. 2-minute time limit
3. Two steers are turned loose in the arena
4. Both Steers must be roped and tied down before the time is called.
5. After time is called, both steers must remain tied for the required 6 seconds.

WILD COW MILKING

Four-person timed event representing how to rope a cow in the middle of the pasture to help a calf drink.

1. Four (4) person event including a Header, Tailer, Milker and Mugger.
2. Three (3) minute time limit.
3. Cow must be caught by head loop; one front foot allowed. Belly loops not accepted. NO heel loops.
4. All riders must be behind the starting line; all other team members go to stop designated by the judges.
5. When the horn sounds, only header can cross the line.
6. Once the header has caught the cow, the tailer, milker, and mugger can leave the designated area and come into play.
7. The roper must be holding the cow when the cow is being milked. (Roper must remain on horse and be dallied up)
8. Milker must then run the bottle of milk by foot over to the judges and hand over to the designated judge.
9. Milker must fill the bottle with enough milk that it runs out for the judge to pour himself.
10. The team with the fastest time wins the event for that performance.

MEN'S RANCH SADDLE BRONC

A judged event where the contestant must ride a bucking horse for 8 seconds. Points will be awarded for the difficulty of the horse and for the degree of aggressiveness, control, and exposure demonstrated by the rider.

1. Ride as you can for 8 Seconds.
2. A standard working saddle must be used.
3. ABSOLUTELY NO PRCA or CPRA rigging allowed.
4. Horse must be saddled as he would for everyday use.
5. A regular bucking horse halter with one reign must be used and will be provided.
6. No hobbling of one or both stirrups
7. Points will be awarded for the difficulty of the horse also for the degree of aggressiveness, control, and exposure demonstrated by the rider. 50% of the score goes to the rider and 50% goes to the horse.
8. A re-ride may be awarded at the judge's discretion.
9. The team with the highest score wins the event for that performance.

*Not mandatory for a team to have a competitor entered in the Bronc, however, if a team member enters and places, those points will be added to their aggregate total.

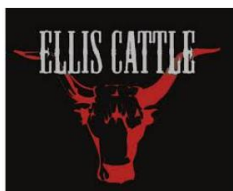
