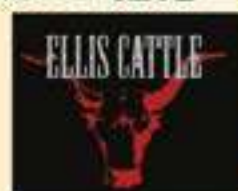

ENTRY INFORMATION:

- Entries can be submitted online at dawsoncreekex.ca, by email to entries@dawsoncreekex.ca, or in person at the Summer Office.
- All online entries will close at Midnight, Monday, August 3rd, 2026 (unless otherwise stated in Division). Any entries after this date must be submitted in person at the Summer Office.
- Please pick up your Exhibitor Package at the Summer Office upon arrival to Exhibition Grounds.
- All Exhibitors must purchase a \$4.00 membership to the Dawson Creek Exhibition Association to be paid with entries.
- All prize money must be picked up from the Summer Office by Wednesday, August 12th, at 12:00pm. No prize money will be mailed out.
- **Check your Division Rules & Regulations regarding exhibit drop off and pick up times.**
- All entries except livestock must be the creation or the product of the effort and work of the Exhibitor and must have been completed within the previous 12 months unless otherwise stated.
- In the absence of competition in any class, or if entries exhibited are of inferior quality, the judges will award only such prizes as they deem the exhibit merits.
- Should any question arise not provided for in the Rules & Regulations, the decision of the Board of Directors is final.
- Protests must be made in writing, stating the grounds for the protest and accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00 which will not be refunded if the protest is deemed frivolous by the protest committee. No protest should be entered regarding the merit of an animal or an article exhibited. The decision of the judge or judges on the point is final.
- All Exhibitors please take note of the Responsibility Clause when exhibiting entries in all sections.

EXHIBITOR PARKING & TRAFFIC REGULATIONS:

- **Under no circumstances will vehicles (except ambulance, fire and police) be permitted to move within the fair grounds between the hours of 12:00pm-9:00pm Wednesday, August 5th, 2026 & 9:00am-9:00pm from Thursday, August 6th to Sunday, August 9th, 2026.**
- All areas, except for the designated camping spaces **are considered loading/unloading zones**. Livestock Exhibitors are permitted to park in these areas while loading/unloading animals and equipment **ONLY**.
- Parking in any non-parking areas will result in towing at owners expense. This rule is for the safety of the public, Exhibitors and animals. Exhibitors who violate this rule may be disqualified or barred from entering subsequent years as deemed appropriate by the directors.
- Permission to camp will only be granted to Livestock Exhibitors who have paid their Membership and entry fees, as well as obtained a Camping Pass from the Summer Office (please display camping pass in window). There is no charge for camping for Exhibitors. Camping is allowed only in designated areas. See the Summer Office or your Division Director for directions.
- Stock trailers may be parked for the duration of the fair in the designated dry parking section behind the show barn. Stock trailers must be unhooked from vehicle. Area entrance will be marked.

GENERAL RULES:

- No dogs permitted on Fair Grounds, with the exception of certified Service Dogs on a leash.
- No coolers allowed on the grounds. Bags are permitted but subject to searches. Any patron may be searched by Security, if Security feels it necessary for safety on the grounds.

VENDOR RULES:

- You are responsible for keeping your booth and area clean at all times. All trash must be properly disposed of in the dumpsters provided behind the row of booths, by the midway, and beside the camp shack unit. Please do not use small blue barrels.
- All cardboard must be broken down and put into the cardboard dumpster behind the camp shack.
- Grease Disposal: We do not offer this service. It is your responsibility to dispose of it. Do not leave it behind.
- Water: Please bring a hose as spigots are shared and may be a distance from your site. Grey Water disposal is on site but is not included in your rental.
- Fire Extinguisher: You must have a fire extinguisher present in your booth. The Dawson Creek Fire Department will inspect all vendors as part of the pre-event inspection.
- All sales are to be made from your assigned booth/space.

Exhibitor Policies & Code of Conduct

RESPONSIBILITY CLAUSE:

The Dawson Creek Exhibition Association and the Livestock Committee will not be held responsible for any loss, theft, injury, illness, damage, or death involving livestock, equipment, personal property, or individuals participating in or attending the Exhibition, regardless of cause.

By submitting an entry, each Exhibitor acknowledges and accepts all risks associated with participating in the Exhibition, including the handling, transportation, housing, and exhibition of livestock.

Exhibitors agree to indemnify and hold harmless the Dawson Creek Exhibition Association, its directors, officers, employees, volunteers, committee members, and representatives from and against any claims, damages, losses, liabilities, or expenses arising from the actions of the exhibitor, their animals, or any person under their care or supervision.

Exhibitors are fully responsible for the care, custody, control, and conduct of their animals and personal property at all times.

POSITION STATEMENT ON ANIMAL RIGHTS & WELFARE:

The Dawson Creek Exhibition Association proudly produces and manages the Annual Dawson Creek Exhibition and Stampede in Dawson Creek, British Columbia. This volunteer-driven event celebrates our western heritage, country traditions, and agricultural community, and has become one of the largest community-based events in Northern B.C.

The Dawson Creek Exhibition Association supports the responsible and humane use of animals and believes that all animals involved in entertainment, agriculture, industry, and sport deserve proper care, treatment, and management.

We believe that all rodeo events and agricultural fair activities sanctioned or approved by professional rodeo associations and exhibition organizations should be evaluated on an individual animal basis, with animal welfare remaining the highest priority.

The Dawson Creek Exhibition Association does not support animal rights philosophies that oppose all human interaction or partnership with animals. We believe animals can responsibly and ethically serve as partners in agriculture, sport, education, and entertainment when treated with appropriate care, respect, and welfare standards.

CODE OF CONDUCT:

1.1 All DCEA Participants Will:

- a) Demonstrate good sportsmanship, leadership, and ethical conduct at all times, with consideration for the safety of all participants and animals, and in support of the integrity of the DCEA Exhibition and competitions.
- b) Ensure that their participation, and the participation of anyone associated with their exhibit, complies with all DCEA Rules and Regulations and this Code of Conduct.
- c) Promote a safe and respectful environment by avoiding any behaviour before, during, or after the competition that could compromise the safety or well-being of other participants, spectators, or animals.
- d) Provide responsible care in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their animals, including any animals placed in their care.
- e) Support the ongoing health and well-being of animals by encouraging regular inspections and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to maintain high standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation, and safety.
- f) Treat all participants, exhibitors, judges, officials, staff, volunteers, sponsors, and spectators with respect and dignity, and refrain from behaviour that is threatening, intimidating, or inappropriate.
- g) Maintain professional behaviour that promotes public confidence in the DCEA and the integrity of the sport and competition.
- h) Refrain from publicly criticizing judges, exhibition officials, or exhibition staff regarding the handling of duties, disputes, or disciplinary matters related to the DCEA Rules and Regulations or this Code of Conduct.
- i) Cooperate with the enforcement of all DCEA Rules and Regulations and this Code of Conduct, and accept the authority and decisions of judges, exhibition officials, and the Exhibition Safety Commission.

Rules, Regulations & Information:

- All Exhibitors must purchase a \$4.00 membership to the Dawson Creek Exhibition Association to be paid with entries.
- **Entries can be submitted online at dawsoncreekex.ca, by email to entries@dawsoncreekex.ca, or in person at the Summer Office. Online Entries will close Monday, August 3rd.**
- Please pick up your Exhibitor Package at the Summer Office upon arrival to Exhibition Grounds.
- All rules will be based on 4-H BC Rules & Regulations, and are available at <https://www.4hbc.ca/publications>.
- All Exhibitors must be a current member of a registered 4-H Club. **Membership proof is required.**
- Cloverbud: 6-8 years of age as of December 31st of the previous year.
- Juniors: 9-12 years of age as of December 31st of the previous year.
- Seniors: 13-21 years of age as of December 31st of the previous year.
- Sections A1-A4 and non-livestock projects are open to all 4-H members.
- To exhibit in any of the 4-H livestock projects classes, you must be registered in that project.
- All livestock exhibits must be the members projects registered for the current year.
- **Animal identification must be provided for all livestock at the time of registration for classes (obtain copy from 4-H Leader).**
- 4-H members may enter open classes with their livestock. Open class entry fees are to be paid by the member.
- Judges will place the classes, and their decisions will be accepted as final.
- Water will be available on site, but each exhibitor must provide feed and bedding, and look after their livestock.
- The Exhibition Association will not be responsible for any losses or accidents to exhibits and animals.
- Cattle need to be on the grounds by Thursday, August 6th, at 6:00pm. Weigh-in will take place Friday, August 7th at 10:00am in the cattle barn.
- Sheep and Goats need to be on the grounds by Wednesday, August 5th, at 6:00pm. Weigh-in will take place Thursday, August 6th at 8:00am.
- Displays and animals must remain on the grounds until Sunday, August 9th, 2026 at 5:00pm. If removed earlier, your prize money may be forfeited.

All 4-H projects on display are made, raised, or trained throughout the 4-H year. The award system is designed to aid the individual personal development of each 4-H member, with awards given based on personal achievement.

- Overflow of stalling will be at the auction mart.
- In the event of space/stall restrictions, some horses (halter) may be released early. Decisions will be made at the directors discretion.
- Feed and tack stalls only if space permits.

Ring Regulations:

- All Exhibitors are to follow Ring Stewards direction.
- All Exhibitors shall wear their Exhibitor number on their backs, or placed on the back of their cart or wagon. Only one number can be shown at a time. Any Exhibitor using the wrong number in the ring, or having no number may be excused from the class, or may be disqualified in the event of a subsequent protest.
- Horses shall not be allowed to be punished unnecessarily or severely.
- All entires must be clean and well groomed including handlers, harness and horse drawn equipment.
- Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on part of the owner, groom, rider or driver may disqualify a horse from adjudication.
- Contestants must be in the holding ring 10 minutes before their class. Once the show ring gate is closed and the judge is told that is his class, no further entries will be allowed.
- Contestants entering in classes specifically designed for Juniors must not have passed their 19th birthday by July 1st, 2026. Proof of age must be available on request.
- Exhibitor is responsible to point out to the show committee any refunds they have coming.
- The show committee feels its only proper that winners of prizes write a note of appreciation to the donors of the same.
- No stallions will be handled by Junior Exhibitors.

Any Exhibitor from out of province with farm plates hauling show horses is exempt of weigh scale fees.

TRAFFIC:

Under no circumstances will vehicles (except ambulance, fire and police) be permitted to move within the fair grounds between the hours of 12:00pm-9:00pm Wednesday, August 5th, 2026 & 9:00am-9:00pm from Thursday, August 6th to Sunday, August 9th, 2026.

All animals and exhibitors shall have posted release times. A slip will be provided by the barn boss.

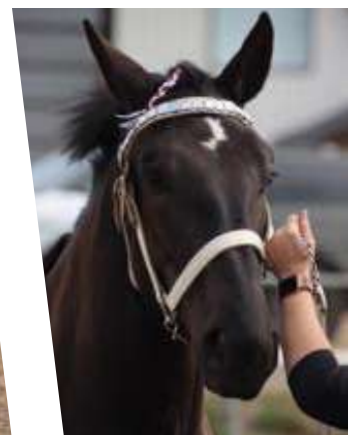

Section C4: Draft Horse Pull

Rules & Regulations:

- Boundary lines are 16 feet apart in all classes.
- Length of pull, 14 feet - Allowed two tries to make 14 feet. Any movement of the boat is considered a try. The pin and chain laid out flat measures 14 feet. Pin must be out completely to qualify as a pull.
- All Team weights must be shown on entry form to determine the proper class.
- Teams will be weighed on the grounds prior to the show.
- All classes will be pulled pounds overweight.
- Offset double trees allowed.
- Neck yokes allowed.
- Each Teamster is allowed two helpers. One header, one hooker, or two hookers. Teamster and hookers may stay behind double tree when team is pulling. If helpers coach or interfere while the team is hooked to the boat, the team will be disqualified and revert to previous completed pull.
- Teamster or hooker may ride in the boat (must stay in boat the entire pull).
- While hooked to the boat, the team must stay within the guidelines. If the team steps on or over the guidelines, they will be disqualified and allowed their previous completed pull. A Teamster may ask the judge to center the boat before hooking. If there is no means available to center the boat, the judge may wave off the guideline rule and ask the Teamster to center the boat during the pull.
- If a break in harness or equipment occurs, there will be a time limit to fix the break and complete the pull. If a Teamster forfeits the pull at which the breakage occurred, he must pull the next weight the full distance or the weight goes back to the previous completed pull.
- Deliberate stalling will result in disqualification.
- The committee reserves the right to conduct a spot check by a veterinarian for contesting teams. Unethical use of drugs will result in disqualification and forfeiture of all winnings.
- Deliberate jerking of the load is prohibited. If the infraction occurs the team is eliminated from the pull and allowed their previous completed pull.
- Judges decisions are final. No consultation with the judge shall be allowed.
- Any entry may be excused by the judge without explanation, if the judge deems the entry is unsafe or incorrect for the class.
- Once the team is hooked, started into or asked to pull, the team must stay between the guidelines until the pull is completed and team is unhooked.
- Team allowed two tries to move the boat 14 feet.
- A Teamster has the option of waving the first lift. Second lift must be pulled by Teamster taking the option.
- Teamster may unhook after first try and has three minutes to re-hook and complete the pull.
- If only one class: class shall be from heaviest team to lightest team, or by order deemed by the committee.
- All pullers must enter one other draft horse class to be eligible to enter pull classes (your choice).
- Teamster is not to touch, whip or snap lines during the pull or will be disqualified and revert to previous weight pulled (judges discretion).
- Draft horse pull may not be entered by a Junior Exhibitor 19 and under.**

Team Sorting:

This four-person timed event requires teams to sort and pen the correct steer from the herd within a two-minute time limit, with a 30-second warning provided. Time begins when the first rider crosses the line, and the announcer will call the number of the steer to be penned. The herd must be handled in a calm, controlled manner throughout the event. Teams will be disqualified if more than four steers cross the line, although one odd-numbered steer may cross the foul line as long as it is returned to the herd before time expires.

Team Doctoring:

This four-person timed event demonstrates the process of roping and treating a sick animal in the pasture within a two-minute time limit. Once the steer has been headed and heeled, the third team member removes the head loop, ropes the front legs, and ensures both hind legs are secured. A front-leg catch is acceptable for heading, and a belly loop with both hind legs is allowed. The third team member then marks the steer as treated using a coloured marker, while the fourth team member may assist by holding the herd, horses, or helping as needed. Time is called when the doctor returns to the saddle, is mounted, and the steer remains securely roped with both front and hind legs in the loop. Teams are limited to four loops. No major herd disruptions or scattering of the herd is allowed. Dally short, no long sloppy handles. Any rope lost will result in disqualification.

Team Branding:

This four-person timed event requires teams to rope and brand three calves within a four-minute time limit using a single branding iron. A 30-second penalty will be added if only one foot is roped. Calves must cross the chalk line before wrestlers can touch them, although contestants may touch the rope while behind the line without penalty. Teams will be disqualified if a heeler drags a single high hock across the line, if the branding iron leaves the pot before the rope is removed from the calf, or if any rope is lost. Only one calf may cross the line at a time, and after the first calf is branded, all remaining calves must be branded on the same side and in the same location. Time stops once the branding iron is returned to the pot. Calves must be handled smoothly and respectfully, with no rough handling or excessive high-hock shake downs, and disqualifications may be issued at the judges' discretion.

Stray Gathering:

This four-person timed event requires teams to rope and tie down two stray steers released into the arena before the two-minute time limit expires. Both steers must be successfully roped and tied before time is called, and after the run is completed, each steer must remain tied for the required six-second count.

Wild Cow Milking:

This four-person timed event represents the process of roping a cow in the pasture to help a calf nurse. Team members include a header/rider, tailer, milker, and mugger, and the event carries a three-minute time limit. The cow must be caught with a head loop, with one front foot allowed, while belly loops and heel loops are not permitted. All header/riders must remain behind the starting line while the remaining team members wait in an area designated by the judges. When the horn sounds, only the header may cross the line, and once the cow has been caught, the tailer, milker, and mugger may enter the arena to assist. The header must remain mounted, dallied up, and holding the cow while it is being milked. The milker must then run the bottle of milk on foot to the judges and hand it to the designated judge. The bottle must contain enough milk to allow the judge to pour it himself. The fastest team time wins the event for that performance.

Men's Ranch Saddle Bronc:

This judged event requires contestants to ride a bucking horse for eight seconds while demonstrating control, aggressiveness, and exposure throughout the ride. Scoring is divided evenly, with 50 percent awarded for the rider's performance and 50 percent for the difficulty and action of the horse. Contestants must use a standard working saddle, and no PRCA or CPRA rigging is permitted. Horses must be saddled as they would be for everyday ranch work, and a regular bucking horse halter with one rein, supplied by the organizers, must be used. Hobbling one or both stirrups is not allowed. A re-ride may be granted at the judges' discretion, and the contestant with the highest score wins the event for that performance.

Not mandatory for a team to have a competitor entered in Bronc, however, if a team member enters and places, those points will be added to their aggregate total. Men's bronc is open to any man wanting to compete for prize money.

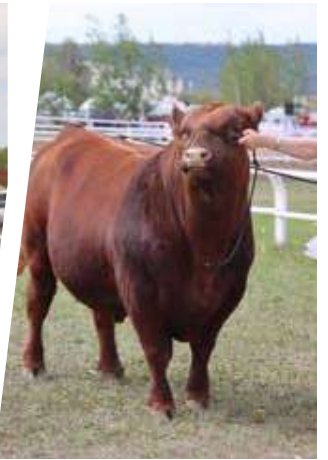
